Select and Register Your Singers Now!

Each choir (school or community) can select and send a **maximum of 10** treble voice singers in Grades 5-9.



Registration of singers is done by their conductors online at www.nscf.ns.ca. (Open now!) This online form will reserve their spot on a first come, first serve basis until we hit our maximum.

Conductors should collect and submit their singers' registration fees and completed forms (available on the website for download) and submit to office in one package. Final date for receipt of all online registrations, forms and fees: Friday, 31 January, 2020. (Late packages will be moved to the waiting list.)

Help, my school doesn't have a choir! Can I go?

Yes! We don't want you to miss out on CCNS!

(which qualifies them for discount at our camp programs as well!).

However, individual singers not being sent by a choir still must have a person to help them learn the music, and who will vouch that they will be prepared for the final weekend.

Commitment to Excellence

Singers are required to **learn their music on their own**, with help from their music teachers. Singers will be provided with online practice recordings to help them learn their parts. **Notes, words and rhythms should be in place before the regional rehearsal**. All music and materials will be delivered to the conductors of the selected singers by February 14, 2020.

Choristers <u>must</u> be able to commit to the following dates: (all rehearsals and performances are mandatory for participation)

Regional Rehearsals

February 29(HRM) & March 1(Kingston), March 8(Truro): Singers <u>must</u> attend <u>one</u> of three regional rehearsals. These rehearsals will be in HRM, the Valley and Central NS.

Rehearsal/Concert Weekend - Halifax April 3 - 5

The final rehearsal session culminating in a final concert Sunday afternoon. See website for schedule.

How much does it cost and what do they get?

\$95 per singer (if singer is recommended from a NSCF member organization - school/choir/church/studio etc.)

\$110 per singer (for singers who do not have a choir to recommend them. This fee also provides the individual with a student membership to the NSCF. More info on reverse.)
